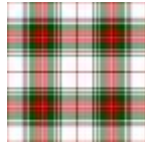
Questionnaire

PRIMARY 1

FIRST LEVEL (P2, P3 AND P4)

PRIMARY 2

This month P2 and P2/3 pupils have completed a Money Sense workshop. They discussed the difference between needs and wants, the best ways to spend their money and the importance of calculating costs.

We have been doing lots of fun activities with our Read, Write, Count bags and we are looking forward to sharing these with parents. A letter will follow soon.

We have been learning about kindness and the different ways we can be kind. Our classes have been set a challenge to complete 100 acts of kindness. Every time we carry out a kind act we fill in and write our name on one of the 100 squares.



PRIMARY 3

P3 pupils have been very busy with their Ancient Egypt topic this month. We have been learning all about what it was like to live during that time, how they built the pyramids, what they were for, and even how to write using hieroglyphs. P3A recently led a fantastic assembly about what they had learnt so far in the topic. P3B pupils have been working hard this week for their World Book Day assembly to the rest of school on Friday.



PRIMARY 4

P4 pupils have continued to work hard this term. We wrapped-up the electricity topic, and presented our learning at a Friday all-school assembly. We have started our next topic all about the Roman Empire.

In Numeracy/Maths, we have been deepening our understanding of number through practice with fractions. We have also been exploring number and picture patterns. Most recently, we are discussing the topic of symmetry and discovering symmetry all around us.

In writing, we have been looking at elements of opinion writing. We have chosen a topic to write a review about to help us develop our opinion writing techniques.

In science, we will be learning all about solids, liquids and gases and we look forward to experimenting with changing states of materials.



SECOND LEVEL (P5, P6 AND P7)

PRIMARY 5

P5 have had a busy time putting together their project for the Bonnyrigg Historical Society. We have looked at the changing face of Bonnyrigg and have put together a trail around the local area, where participants are required to find information as they follow the trail. We had a rather cold but enjoyable walk around the trail, gathering information and generating questions.

We are very excited about the upcoming skiing lessons and we have had a visit from a member of the Ski Centre who told us what to expect, what to wear and identified which helmet to wear. We will be leaving at 9am sharp on Wednesday. We are to wear our skiing clothes to school and bring clothes to change into in case we get wet. Keep an eye on Twitter for photos of each session.



PRIMARY 6

Last term P6 enjoyed a trip to the Mining Museum to learn about engineering and how the new Queensferry Crossing is being built. At the bridge building we worked in two teams to connect panels to make a model of the new Forth Road Bridge on a smaller scale. To make it withstand our bodyweight we used the same cables as the new bridge but smaller. All in all we enjoyed this co-operative trip!

P6A

In Maths P6A have been learning to use a compass properly. During this exercise we created our own patterns to create a wall display for our classroom.

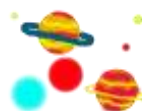
P6B

PRIMARY 7

On Monday P7A had a workshop about cycling helmets. We watched a video about the Olympian James Cracknell, who suffered brain damage after a cycling accident. James was cycling when a lorry drove past, and its wing mirror hit James on the back of his head, knocking him to the floor and breaking his helmet in half. Luckily he was wearing a helmet, otherwise he could have died according to doctors. James took five years to recover from the accident. We also watched a video about Joe, who decided not to wear a helmet one day due to peer pressure. He fell off his bike and hit his head so hard that his brain began to bleed. After the accident, he had to learn how to talk and walk all over again, and was not able to pursue his dreams of playing football. This made us realise that this could happen to any of us. At the end of the workshop we were asked to design a helmet for an egg to save it from smashing. We were given a variety of materials and worked in groups. We then tested our protection on real eggs and dropped them from high up. Only one team managed to save their egg! The session really made us think twice about not wearing a helmet. At the beginning we were asked how many of us would choose to wear a helmet, and only half the class said they would. We were asked the same question at the end and all of us said we would. We now know how serious the risks are if we don't wear one. P7B will be having their session on 10th March.
